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**Two Prominent Senior Care Companies, Allegiance Physician House Calls and Clinical Care House Calls of Virginia, Merge to Create Better Service for Seniors in Northern Virginia**

**STERLING, VA** - Every day, more than 10,000 people turn 65 years of age in the United States; to serve this booming senior population in terms of health care, two prominent senior care companies in Northern Virginia have joined forces. Allegiance Physician House Calls and Clinical Care House Calls of Virginia have combined to offer a collaborative resource to caring for seniors in the comfort of their own homes.

Clinical Care House Calls of Northern Virginia, PLLS (CCHC) is a sole proprietor company owned by Carol Hodgson, Adult Nurse Practitioner. CCHC has been providing primary care, coordination of care, and mental capacity related services in private homes, senior communities and assisted living facilities in Northern Virginia since 2015.

Allegiance Aging Care Service has been in business since 2014 and provides both Physician House Calls and Private Duty Home Care Services (caregiving services) for seniors living in

Northern Virginia. The House Calls division of Allegiance Aging Care Service provides clinical care in both the private home as well as to residents of senior living communities. In the house call model, referred to as “Convenience Medicine”, the client pays a modest out of pocket convenience fee for their provider to come to them for their medical appointments, while insurance is billed for medical services provided, making “Convenience Medicine” more widely available to seniors; even those on a fixed budget.

In September 2018, CCHC entered into an agreement with Allegiance Physician House Calls to begin the transition of CCHC clients under the purview of the Allegiance team. Carol Hodgson, the owner and managing member of CCHC will work in collaboration with Dr. Rahel Yirga, Internist, the owner of Allegiance Physician House Calls and Medical director of its umbrella company, Allegiance Aging Care Services. Allegiance has recently expanded their clinical team to include an additional physician and three nurse practitioners to provide services to the Northern Virginia area.

“I speak for both Carol and I when I say that we are beyond excited about what this merger means for the future and the ability to provide better access to care for seniors in Northern Virginia” says Pam Reynolds, President and CEO of Allegiance Aging Care Services, “our mission has always been to provide care for seniors so that they may age in place, in the comfort of their own homes. The core values of CCHC are directly in line with ours and we could not be happier about this partnership”
